Vigil for soldiers martyred in Nato attack

ISLAMABAD — The Insani Haqooq Ittehad (IHI) Tuesday organised a candlelight vigil at Super Market to protest against Nato attack on a check post in Mohmand Agency wherein 24 soldiers were killed.

The IHI members termed it an act of aggression and violence, which neither served peace nor diplomatic relations. The organisation prayed for the martyred soldiers and offered condolences to their family members.

Members of the IHI also condemned violence by militants that has resulted in the loss of over 30,000 innocent lives.

Meanwhile, Chief of Muttahida Qabail Party Habib Malik Orakzai has urged the government to sever relations with the United States.

In a statement, he said the war on terror was imposed on Pakistan by a dictator and now we should pull out from it to protect sovereignty and integrity of the country.

He also warned the US and Nato to abstain from implementing their nefarious designs on people of Pakistan, otherwise they would have to face anger and angst of the people.
