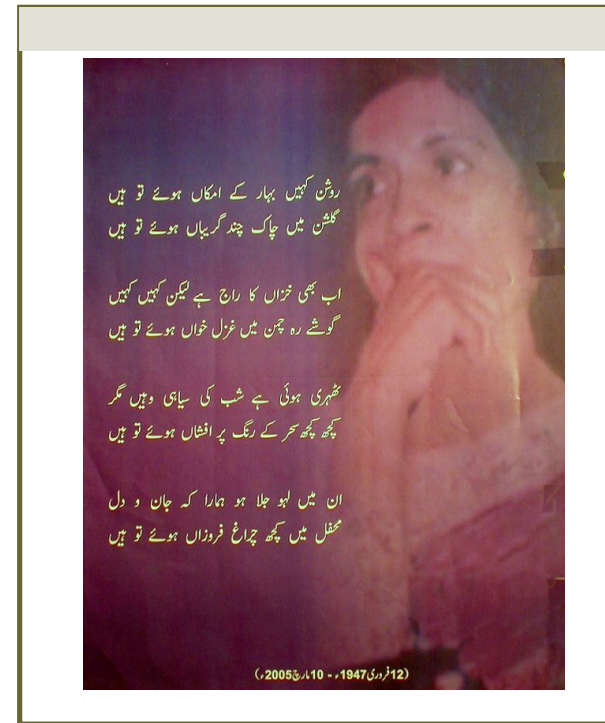

## 'Covid-19 cases up 40% in five days'

City's hospitals nearly full, may run out of space soon, doctors say

 Urging people not to take the pandemic lightly, prominent doctors of the city demanded that the government impose a stricter lockdown.

At a press conference at the Karachi Press Club on Wednesday, the doctors warned that Covid-19 cases would continue to increase exponentially over the next few weeks, pointing out that a 40 per cent rise had been observed in a mere five days.

"We have seen a rapid increase in the number in the last 5 days," stated Dr Abdul Bari, the head of the Indus Hospital, adding that this case at the government

hospitals is nearly full, may run out of space soon, doctors say. He claimed that all the dedicated critical care wards for coronavirus patients in various hospitals across the city were nearly out of capacity, disclosing that the Indus Hospital, Aga Khan University Hospital and Dow University Hospital were full while Jinnah Postgraduate Medical Centre and the Sindh Institute of Urology and Transplant were at 80 per cent saturation.

The doctor also stated that there were already about 100 stable patients at the Expo Centre isolation facility, which has a capacity of 200 patients.

Predicting that the situation would worsen in the

coming days, they said there should not be enough beds to admit coronavirus patients until the spread of the virus, "the severity is much worse than we think," stated Dr Iqbal Khaliq, head of the Dow University of Health Sciences.

Claiming that the doctors in the press conference were representing 90 per cent of those in Pakistan, he said the country did not have enough health professionals to fight the disease.

As the doctor pointed out that 800 members of the medical community had been infected in Sindh, Dr Niaz further appealed for public support, saying that they were distributed by the situation and it would

not be possible for them to battle at the frontline without support.

**PRAYERS** Islamic Medical Association (IMA) Head of the Department of Health Sciences, meanwhile, said that the medical community demanded a strict and complete lockdown to control the spread of the virus. Acknowledging that this could cause difficulties for the poor, he nonetheless said that people could be saved from hunger through philanthropy.

**Respecting mosques** Ushayq with the aletia's demand to reopen mosques for congregational prayers during Ramadan, the doctor appealed to religious autho-

ties to reconsider the recent decision made on this topic. Dr Bari said that they did not want mosques to be closed down, but only the staff should be allowed to offer prayers inside.

He pointed out that since Tarekhat was not obligatory, it should be offered at home.

**Pakistan Medical Association** general secretary Dr Qaiser Bajait said that the government and the media had taken the wrong decision in allowing congregational prayers. Though mosques not following the government's regulations should be closed, he warned that by that time, it may be too late.

"Listen carefully: we do not have space in our hospitals," he stated, stressing the gravity of the situation.

Detailing that all shops and business activities be closed immediately, he said that the Sindh government's lockdown was a better measure to contain the virus. "But even if it is as strict as we mentioned it to be at the start. Now, it is just a joke." Highlighting that they had called the press conference in an emergency, he asserted that the doctors in Pakistan were disturbed. "We are here to inform you that our health infrastructure is fast going. The government cannot control other diseases. How can it control this virus?"

## Local transmission surge worries CM

Provincial capital worst hit by 300 locally transmitted cases

 Sindh Chief Minister Syed Murad Ali Shah revealed that the emergence of over 300 locally transmitted coronavirus cases in Sindh on Wednesday - the highest in a day so far.

In a video statement, he revealed that a total of 300 confirmed cases were reported in the province on Wednesday and among them an astounding 208 were locally transmitted.

This was the highest number of locally transmitted cases ever witnessed by the province, he expressed worry, adding that Karachi had turned out to be worst hit in terms of local transmission cases where the tally had peaked at 1,300.

The CM also stated that close to one Covid-19 deaths were reported in Sindh on Wednesday, raising the death toll to 49 in the province.

Elaborating further, he said that results of 2,097 samples came on Wednesday, of which 100 were positive, raising the province's coronavirus count to 1,315.

Expressing dismay about the resurgence of new cases in Sukkur, he said that while the pilgrims were isolated in Labour Colony in Sukkur, their defiance and refusal to follow government's instructions had resulted in local transmission in the district.

"Now, in the responsibility of people, particularly Sindh of families, religious scholars and others who have influenced, to guide others and encourage them to adopt precautionary measures and social distancing, otherwise it could have spread far in delay populated areas and rural areas and create havoc," he warned.

## Court upholds verdict in cop murder case

Ball plans rejected

 The Sindh High Court rejected on Wednesday the appeal filed by a police officer against a verdict convicting him of murdering a civilian.

Announcing the verdict on the plea, the bench stated that the crime against the victim had been planned and he, as well as his accomplices, had conspired to murder him.

Defendant Rehman and Muhammad Rashid were sentenced to life imprisonment by an anti-terrorism court after they were found guilty of opening fire on a police party and killing constable Sharif in 2012.

The same bench also rejected the bail plea of retired Fisheries Cooperative Society chairman Sultan Qamar Siddiqui, who had been booked in corruption and alienated voters cases.

The accused's counsel said that Siddiqui and Rizvi had been imprisoned for two years as the accountability court hearing the offences had been non-operational due to the judge's absence.

The National Accountability Bureau approach, however, contended that a new judge had been appointed for the court and the relevant statements were now being recorded.

## Traders set to resume business in Ramadan

Losing patience as govt continues to delay framing SOPs, some opened shops on Wednesday

 The Sindh Traders Union, All City Traders Union, Electronics Dealers Association and other traders' bodies have announced that they will resume business from the onset of Ramadan.

Addressing a press conference, traders expressed their loss over not being allowed to resume business despite giving the Sindh government assurances that they would comply with all standard operating procedure (SOP) devised by it.

They complained that the government had contradicted its promise to allow traders to resume business by not framing the SOPs for traders by Wednesday and being inoperational in that regard, the traders said they had decided not to wait any further for the authorities to frame the guidelines. They added that they would not wait any government departments were flooded on remaining business from the first of Ramadan.

Letting out that they were better off working while factories had been permitted to operate, the traders pointed out that since the government was being provided support and re-

lief, they were offered little assistance from the government.

They alleged that the provincial and the federal governments were seemingly wanting to go through the motions.

Meanwhile, apparently having lost patience, shop owners in Karachi's busy market despite government instructions to keep businesses closed.

Following a 15-day police curfew, the spot and attended four representatives of the traders' bodies, including Farooq Nawaz, Muhammad Akbar, Javed Qureshi and Javed Shukor.

The traders stated that they would resume business from the onset of Ramadan.
